Free Legal Help Is Just the Beginning

Asking for help isn't easy for Mark, a disabled veteran who served in the U.S. Military for more than 20 years. This former combat instructor and SWAT team commander has navigated many difficult situations in his life, but when faced with losing his home, he needed legal expertise and an advocate on his side.

While Mark was away from home, in treatment for Traumatic Brain Injury and Post Traumatic Stress Disorder, a bill to

remedy a water and sewer problem in his house mushroomed into an unpaid debt resulting in a lien against his house; then the opposing party moved to foreclose.

Mark and his wife, Sara, found more than free legal aid at Pisgah Legal Services. They say they never felt judged or shamed but were supported through a very difficult and stressful time. PLS Attorney Ben Many negotiated a debt reduction and payment plan so their home could be saved.

At Pisgah Legal Services (PLS), we're finding other reasons to be hopeful for our clients.

New Funds for Low-Income Families

Beginning in July, qualifying families with children will begin to receive the expanded federal Child Tax Credit, in part in the form of monthly checks from the IRS. The credit can be up to \$3,600 for each qualifying child.

The average yearly income of a Pisgah Legal client is \$15,261. To put this in perspective, a family with two parents and three children under six, at this income, will receive \$7,000 in payments for the third stimulus check, \$10,800 in Child Tax Credit, and \$6,660 in Earned Income Tax Credit by filing a tax return, for a total of \$24,460.

This once-in-a-generation initiative alone can be truly life-changing for children and families living in poverty across WNC, but they need to be made aware of it and connected to advocates to access these resources. In short, they need Pisgah Legal Services.

Housing Needs Are Still Critical

The housing moratoria are set to end June 30, and more than 200,000 renter households in NC are estimated to have fallen behind on rent.

Because of the long-lasting economic challenges on our community due to COVID-19, we are preparing for a record number of evictions once the moratoria expire, whether that happens sooner or later this year. In WNC, nearly 50 percent of renters were cost burdened prior to the pandemic (paying greater than 30 percent of their income for rent) in the 11 mountain counties our Homelessness Prevention Program covers.

We can provide early legal intervention to keep difficult situations from spiraling out of control and forcing families, seniors, children and other

vulnerable people into homelessness. And, as you can see from Mark's story on the cover, many other local people not covered by the eviction moratoria need our help to stay housed and avoid foreclosure.

People in need of health insurance can also find new savings at Healthcare.gov, but, again, they often need professional and caring advocates to help them understand

their options, access these important savings, and sign up for care. Last Open Enrollment we saw double-digit increases in sign-ups in many of our mountain counties. We want to continue getting local folks covered!

There is reason to hope, and there is reason to help your neighbors connect to resources they desperately need through Pisgah Legal Services. As things begin to return to normal for many of us, let us make sure our neighbors who haven't been as fortunate aren't left behind. **Please give today**, and thank you for your support.


New Savings at Healthcare.gov!

SIGN UP NOW THROUGH AUG 15 FOR QUALITY HEALTH INSURANCE

More than one million people have signed up for ACA health insurance since the Special Open Enrollment Period began in February. Thanks to new savings from the American Rescue Plan, you may find quality, lower-cost health insurance through the ACA Marketplace.

Pisgah Legal Services and our WNC Enrollment Partners are again offering free assistance for local people to review their options and sign up, folks like Russell and Fran (R). "It's been life-changing," says Fran.

Jerry continues, "The probability of skyrocketing evictions prompted me to request fellow Deerfield residents join with the Deerfield Charitable Foundation to raise funds for Pisgah Legal's homelessness prevention work. This Spring, fellow residents gave \$50,000, then the Foundation matched it for a grand total of \$100,000."

Chris Dismukes, chair of the Deerfield Charitable Foundation Board, says, "Our small community is filled with caring and proactive older adults, and we can't wait to see how the wider WNC community will respond as they learn more about PLS and the work you do!"
