# Nonprofit Resources for Federally Declared Natural Disaster Relief

#### **American Red Cross**

How much is funded? Unspecified

What is funded? Nonprofit organizations providing vital recovery and resiliency services to affected communities in three areas of need: individual and household needs, community recovery capacity building, and community recovery and resiliency.

#### Requirements:

- Minimum three years of 501(c)(3) status
- Minimum institutional annual budget of \$250,000

How to apply: Assistance for Hurricanes Helene and Milton

#### **CAPTRUST: Community Foundation Crisis Grants**

How much is funded? Average award is \$10,000 - \$30,000

What is funded? Charities that are assisting those severely impacted by a natural disaster or a crisis that negatively impacts a family's ability to thrive.

#### Requirements:

- Charities that serve communities, families, and individuals severely impacted by natural disaster or a crisis may apply for this grant.
- CAPTRUST Employees must apply for this grant on behalf of an organization.

#### **Community Foundation of Burke County**

How much is funded? Up to \$10,000

What is funded? Organizations that have programs benefiting the residents of Burke County in the context of a natural or manmade disaster in the county.

#### Requirements:

- Must have 501(c)(3) status
- Must apply by March 31<sup>st</sup>, 2025 at 5pm.

How to apply: Apply online using their website and guidelines.

#### **Community Foundation of Henderson County**

Applications for Helene Recovery Grants are being accepted on a rolling basis.

How to Apply: Apply on their website.

#### **Community Foundation of Western North Carolina**

How much is funded? Up to \$50,000

What is funded? Providing emergency relief services to individuals or eligible organizations affected by the storm. Grants are not for ongoing operational or staff costs or costs that are or will be covered by other sources. Eligibility for emergency public funding (local, state or federal) will be addressed in the application.

#### Requirements:

• Organization must be 501(c)(3) tax exempt, a faith-based organization, or a public agency serving individuals and families that were affected by the storm in WNC.

#### <u>Duke Energy Foundation - Western North Carolina Long-Term Recovery</u>

How much is funded? Up to \$25,000

What is funded? Nonprofit organizations based in Western North Carolina with programs and projects supporting local and regional long-term recovery.

#### Requirements:

- Have current 501(c)(3) status
- Serve communities also served by Duke Energy
- Serve without discrimination
- Measure, track, and report program outcomes that demonstrate community impact

#### Nantahala Health Foundation - Hurricane Relief

How much is funded? \$12,500

What is funded? Support for emergency relief, disaster response, and recovery efforts.

Requirements: unspecified

How to apply: Apply on their website.

#### North Carolina Community Foundation - Disaster Relief Fund

NCCF is not currently distributing grants. Please review the information on grants available from NCCF's <u>affiliate foundations</u> in Avery, Cherokee, Clay, Graham, Haywood, Jackson, Macon, Madison, and Swain Counties.

#### Requirements:

- Address long-term recovery and resiliency
- Meet unmet needs not being fulfilled by other resources
- Build stronger and more prepared communities

#### **WNC Bridge Foundation**

How much is funded? Up to \$10,000.

What is funded? NOW Grants can help bridge gaps in funding, allowing nonprofits to pay staff, maintain services, and provide ongoing support during the recovery period. Applications are due on the 15<sup>th</sup> of each month.

IMPACT Grants empower nonprofits to address critical needs arising from Hurricane Helene and can be used for direct program expenses as well as services including utilities, transportation, and essential supplies needed to maintain operations. **Proposals due February 7**<sup>th</sup>, **2025.** 

#### Requirements:

- Organization must be a 501(c)(3) tax exempt organization
- Addressing the needs of individuals in any of the 18 counties or the Qualla Boundary of WNC
- Majority of work should align with a WNC Bridge Foundation focus area: basic needs, mental, and youth development.
