

Summer Law Student Poverty Law Positions

Pisgah Legal Services (PLS) seeks to pursue justice by providing legal assistance and advocacy to help low-income people in Western North Carolina meet basic needs and improve their lives.

PLS offers unpaid summer positions for first- and second-year law students. Students will learn about a wide variety of public interest law areas. Students will be matched with one or more teams (e.g. domestic violence, benefits, housing, immigration, disaster legal services, etc.) for primary work, and will also have learning opportunities with a variety of specialized legal practice areas and other wholistic services provided by PLS.

Students will work full-time (37.5 hours per week). While PLS is unable to pay a stipend, we will do our best to locate affordable housing solutions for the summer law students, though this is not guaranteed.
